

# Scoop Words

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**Scoop Words** is a fast-paced tabletop card game where players simultaneously compete to find words from matching pairs of letters and letter fragments.

## **COMPONENTS:**

150 letter fragment cards and 35 A-Z letter cards.

## **GOAL:**

Find three-letter words and be the top scorer.

## **GAME PLAY:**

There are several ways to play with slightly different setups.

1. Simultaneous free-for-all to scoop many words
2. Scoop one word only
3. Scoop using cards in your hand

## **SETUP #1:**

Shuffle all the single letter cards and place face down as the draw pile. Shuffle the fragment cards and scatter face up between the players. Decide upon how many words can be scooped in each round. Activate your digital timer.

## **GAME PLAY #1:**

Game play is fast-paced. On each 15-second round, players must simultaneously make one or more words.

A player flips over a letter card and each player has 15 seconds to find one or more letter fragments that together with their letter card makes a word. The actions are:

- Flip over a letter card
- Start your (digital) timer
- Scoop a word fragment that combine with the letter card makes a valid word.

At the end of the round:

- Call out each word to validate it
- Calculate the points obtained
- Return the A-Z letter card to a discard pile.

Use strategy and timing to find the best combination of letter and fragment to yield the highest points.

### **SCORING:**

Add up the points on both the A-Z letter card and fragment cards. For example, [B] + [OX] scores  $1+4=5$  points.

However, if two words can be made, double the score: eg, [EA] + [T] makes both TEA and EAT for a total of  $2 \times 4 = 8$  points.

Point values are based on rarity of words made with certain letters and fragments. The rarer the possibility of a combination, the higher the value.

### **ENDING THE GAME:**

The game is over when the fragment pile has been depleted.

## **VALIDITY:**

If the word is found in any dictionary or encyclopedia, it is deemed valid. Familiar words such as first names, product names and brand names are allowed. Generally, however, abbreviations and acronyms should not be allowed.

## **DISPUTES:**

If someone makes an invalid word that is disputed, that person loses their turn.

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
